

## **1. MDPRS Divisions**

The MDPRS will have 3 Divisions. All shooters must declare the Division in which they will be competing when they register for a match. Shooters are permitted to shoot in multiple Divisions in the same season. It is imperative for shooters to ensure they are registered in the correct Division for all matches if they plan on competing in multiple Divisions. It is the shooter's responsibility to ensure they are scored in the correct Division. Failure to do so will result in a Match DQ. The following rules govern each of the divisions.

### **1.1 Open Division**

Open Division rifles will be any caliber up to and including .308 Winchester (no .30 magnum calibers), with a maximum velocity of 3,150 fps.

### **1.2 Production Division**

Production Division rifles will be those that meet the guidelines as detailed in the Precision Rifle Series rules. It is the shooter's responsibility to make sure their equipment falls within these guidelines. Caliber and velocity limits will be the same as for the Open Division. The Production Division was created to encourage growth in our shooting community by allowing shooters the opportunity to compete in events without being disadvantaged due to equipment. This Division is not designed to be gamed by experienced shooters, and shooters registered in the Production Division may be moved to Open Division at the discretion of the Match Director or BOD. Any shooter that qualified for the series finale in Production Division will move to Open Division in subsequent years regardless of their rifle specifications. ### **1.3 DMR Division**

DMR Division rifles will be semi-automatic (AR-15) chambered in 223/5.56

## **2. Match & Series Scoring**

2.1 Match scoring will be completed using a performance system where the first-place shooter receives 100 points and all other shooter's (regardless of Division) will receive points by dividing their score by the winner's score and multiplying that number by 100.

2.2 Series scoring will be determined by totaling individual scores from three (3) matches. The three match scores used will be 1) The shooter's best score from any NHRPC match, 2) The shooter's best score from any MGPA match, and 3) The shooter's best score from any other match.

2.3 To facilitate season scoring, all shooters must have an MDPRS Shooter Number. To obtain a number, use the below link to fill out the form. Once you complete the form, you can use the second link to find your Shooter Number. You will need this number to register for all MDPRS matches.

### **3. Finale Qualification**

To qualify for the series finale, a shooter must meet the following criteria.

3.1 Shoot 3 qualifying matches, with at least one at NHRPC and MGPA

3.2 Finish the season in the top 25 of the Open Division

3.3 Finish the season in the top 1/3 of the Production or DMR Divisions

3.4 Support the MDPRS and your fellow shooters by acting as Match Director or Range Officer for at least one match in 2019

### **4. Match Registration**

Registration for all matches will be conducted using Practiscore.com. Registration for each match will open at 8pm EST on the Monday 4 weeks prior to the match date.

4.1 Upon registering for a match, you will receive a confirmation of registration email. This does not mean that you are on the active roster for that match. Those that make the active roster will receive an approval email and will have 24 hours to pay the match fee. Shooters that fail to pay within 24 hours will be moved to the bottom of the waiting list and their spot will be offered to another shooter.

4.2 All match fees are non-refundable. Match registration and fees can be transferred to another shooter up until 8:00pm the Friday before the match, and it is the shooter's responsibility to handle any financial transactions. Both shooters must send an email thru Practiscore stating that the transfer is taking place. No transfers will be allowed after 8:00pm the Friday before the match.

## **6. Code of Conduct and Sportsmanship**

5.1 Unsportsmanlike conduct by any participant will not be tolerated.

5.2 Unsportsmanlike conduct includes but is not limited to: arguing with other competitors or match officials, throwing of equipment or any other temper tantrum-like behavior, heckling other shooters while they are shooting, use of vulgar/offensive language, habitual whining, and any other action that may be outside the norm of what is considered to be professional behavior.

5.3 Penalties for unsportsmanlike infractions are left to the discretion of the MD. The general guidelines for MD's are first time offenders are given a warning and their second offense will result in a Match DQ and they will be asked to leave the premises. If, however, the MD determines the infraction to be of a serious nature, he/she may have the offender removed immediately.

5.4 Habitual offenders risk a full season suspension and disqualification from the series finale. This can only be enforced by the BOD.
