YOUR TRAINING IS APPROACHING

Just wanted to drop you a line to make sure everyone is on course to have a successful outing. This is not a competition in any way, shape, form or fashion, however we'd like you to have a good time in a casual, relaxed, but very technical, fast-moving learning environment..

PREPARATION IS IMPORTANT.

Please take the following notes into consideration and work up your skills to a solid basic foundation for us to build upon. There will be an initial assessment of what skill and fundamentals you bring to the course.

Gear Check:

Rifle; zeroed. 100-yard zero, as tight as you can get it, from a prone position. Muzzle-Velocity acquired. (Very helpful for downrange solutions)

Screws torqued properly on rifle and scope. Most screws to rings no more than 15 in/lb.!!!

Bore and chamber clean. Especially the chamber.

Any necessary tools for adjustment of your scope and rifle. Know your scope's adjustments!!

Ground gear: Bipod, Rear Bag(s), Data Book (whether you know what to do with it or not. And this can be just a note pad if necessary). Ground pad to lay on. Extra magazines. Writing instruments. 150 rounds of ammo that will make it to 1,000 yards with predictable accuracy and precision.

Kestrel Weather Meter if you have one.

Ballistics calculator or means of getting a solution if you have it.

ThermaCell or bug dope.

Appropriate dress:

Tacti-Cool is great if you can afford it. Otherwise, just make sure you are warm enough and dry enough.

Attitude:

Bring your friendly, trainable, open-to-constructive-criticism attitude. Adherence to safety rules are a must, and violation will get you an escort off premises. You'll make some great friends who you do not know, so be approachable. Know-it-alls will be readily identifiable. :-]]

Where and when:

Sheep Creek Lodge, the evening prior to your Day 1. About 6 p.m., ready to meet and greet, eat dinner or have a couple beverages. Have your overnight Lodge arrangements made no

later than this week. If you cannot get in until Day 1, we meet for Breakfast at 7:00 a.m. at the Lodge, and we proceed to the range soon thereafter. The Lodge is at mile 88, Parks Hwy, and the Range is mile 94.2.

The Lodge will cater Lunch to the firing line. Bring a handful of \$20's for food. Lunch averages \$12-\$13.

Leave your rifle in your vehicle until told to move it. NO AMMO EVER in the classroom.
